



Call for Posters (CfP) Swiss Gender Medicine Symposium

The Swiss Gender Medicine Symposium 2025 brings together researchers, decision makers, educators, students and clinicians in gender medicine as well as representatives from business, research-oriented foundations and politics. The symposium thus offers the opportunity to share your work with colleagues and potential research sponsors and investors.

The Scientific Program Committee invites researchers in the field of gender medicine to contribute posters to the Symposium.

Subjects

Posters should showcase research on the influence of sex and gender in medicine, namely on the following subjects:

- Research entering the phase of translation into practical application
- Gender-sensitive treatment in clinical setting
- Data science, big data and AI

The Symposium is particularly interested in posters that highlight the innovation potential of sex- and gender-specific research and its translation into clinical practice.

This call is open for researchers at all levels and all studies.

Presentation at the Symposium

The Poster will be presented at the Swiss Gender Medicine Symposium in a specific poster section. In the long breaks there will be poster walks in groups of the above-mentioned subjects, in which you will have the possibility to present your research in a 2 to 3-minutes-presentation. We suggest to add a recording of your presentation to the poster with a QR-code, so it can be viewed upon request. Presenters should be available at the poster for questions during fixed times at the symposium. Authors, title and a short abstract will be published on the program section of the Symposium website.

Poster Prizes

There will be given a poster prize for each group mentioned above including a donation of CHF 1000.- and a publication of the winners through the channels of the Symposium.

Requirements for Abstracts

Abstracts should include

1. Title (please use a short and specific title)
2. Background
3. Objectives
4. Methods
5. Results / expected results
6. Conclusions & impact

The abstract should be written in English with a maximum of 250 words.
